### FROM THE PAST

I am looking back on the equivalent weekend to this (14th April) 5, 10, 20 and 30 years ago.

Five years ago on 13th April 2013 a 2-1 home win over bottom club Aldershot secured League Two survival for the Blues, who would eventually finish 15th.

Matt McClure, making his 50th appearance for us, scored the opener and, after the Shots had equalised, he laid on the winner for Joel Grant.

The team that day was: Ingram, Harriman, Dunne, Scowen, Winfield (L. Johnson), Doherty, Grant, Morgan (Kuffour), McClure, Spring, Wood (Andrade). Matt of course now plies his trade at Aldershot.

Five years previously, again on the 13th April, we visited a certain team in North Bucks, who were looking to clinch promotion to League One. We were trying to seal a play-off spot and only an injury-time equaliser from the home side denied us a win, the game finishing 2-2. Our goals were both scored by Scott McGleish, taking his League tally for the

season to 25, becoming the first player to reach this total for league goals since Tony Horseman did so in the Isthmian League campaign of 1969/70.

The line-up was: Fielding, Martin, Woodman, L. Johnson, Williamson, Holt, Torres, Doherty, Knight (Facey), McGleish, Oakes (Herd). Scott finished with 26, a Football League record for us that still stands. We did make the play-offs but lost our semi-final to Stockport.

April 13th 1998 (Easter Monday) saw a League Division Two (now League One) visit to Oldham (our first visit to Boundary Park). Both teams were safely placed in mid-table but we came out on top with a Mark Stallard goal giving us a 1-0 win.

Our line-up twenty years ago was: Taylor, Kavanagh, Beeton, Ryan, Cousins, Mohan, Carroll, Read, Stallard, Harkin, Brown.

Thirty years ago we were trying to avoid relegation from the Football Conference as we travelled to Telford on 16th April. A battling performance in a goalless draw



gained us a welcome point, which ultimately helped us stay up.

The line-up was: Lester, Young, Crossley, Day, Barrett, Taylor, Roderick, Boyland (Greenaway), West, Mann, Durham.

### WHERE ARE THEY NOW

Mickey Bell, one of the best left-backs to play for us, has become manager of Western League side Clevedon Town. Also stepping into management, albeit as an assistant manager, is Ben Strevens at Eastleigh, where Sam Togwell has joined other ex-players Chris Zebroski and Sam Wood in their squad. Zebroski has been amongst the goals recently, scoring a hat-trick in a 4-3 home win over Hartlepool. Another amongst the goals. and how good to see, is that wonderful young player Ebere Eze, who seems to be getting a regular game at Loftus Road. I will never forget his brace at Cambridge earlier this season. Likewise, Jordon Ibe netted a cracker for Bournemouth recently.

I was pleased to see Bromley reach the final of the F.A. Trophy after beating Gateshead in the semi-final.

This should give Roger Johnson a trip to Wembley. He blotted his copybook the other week though by getting himself sent off.

Whilst reading the Non-League paper I came across news of some players who, for one reason or another, never set the World alight in their time at Adams Park. Reece Styche, a known goalscorer who has been capped by Gibraltar, but failed to find the net for us, is at Darlington. Rowan Liburd, who also failed to score for us, plays alongside Dayle Southwell at Guiseley. Nicholas Bignall, who was once stretchered off at Adams Park after injuring himself in the pre-match warm-up, is at Hungerford. Ade Azeez has joined Dover on loan from parent club Cambridge United. Finally, congratulations to Alfie Mawson, whose lovely family still visit us for games when he is not playing, for his England call-up. I don't think many of us who saw his consistent displays a few seasons back are surprised, are we ?



### R. I. P.

As I was compiling this newsletter I learnt of the sad death of Ray Wilkins who passed away at the age of just 61. Towards the end of a distinguished career, Ray actually played one game for us as a favour to our manager at the time, Alan Smith. It was on 7th September 1996 in a League game at home to Luton Town, which we lost 1-0. Ray was just seven days short of his 40th birthday and became the oldest player to appear in the League for us. After playing for us Ray then signed for Hibernian before finishing his playing career at Millwall, then Leyton Orient, while, after a string of poor results, Smith was relieved of his duties. Sincere condolences go out to Ray's family and friends.

Footnote- Rob Lee passed Ray's record when he appeared for us at Cheltenham in the play-off game at the end of the 2005/06 season. Rob was then 40 years and 101 days old.
