#### R. I. P.

On Wednesday, 24th October the Club's oldest surviving ex-player, George Wharton, passed away at the age of 97. For Lynden and I it is a personal tragedy as he was her Father. Christened Leslie George but always known by his middle name, he first played during the 1940/41 season and made further appearances when home on leave from service in the Navy. He was actually made a prisoner-ofwar in North Africa after his ship had been torpedoed and the rescue ship had run aground. On his return to England after the War he continued to play for the Club until 1948. Although his overall record for the first team (9 goals in 16 appearances) wasn't great he was a goal-scoring regular on the left-wing for the Reserves and was a member of the side that won the Isthmian League Reserve Section and Wycombe Senior Cup double in the 1946/47 season. After leaving the Club he went on to play for Loudwater and Flackwell Heath before retiring from the game. He was a true gentleman and a wonderful Father and Father-in-Law. Lynden and I are approaching our 50th Wedding Anniversary and, in all that time, never has there been a cross word spoken between George and I. He will be truly missed.

A further loss was Ena Stanmore a lovely lady who, until she could no longer physically go to matches, was a regular both home and away and, at one time, served on our Committee. I remember the lively banter between her and fellow supporters on the away coaches. She would never have a bad word to say about the team, even if we had put in a poor performance. When I organised a little group to go to Ireland for pre-season in the summer of 2001 she was part of it and was wonderful company.



### FOOTBALL MATTERS

It was disappointing to read a newspaper article recently about the decline in Football League attendances, particularly in the lower two divisions and especially for evening games. In recent seasons there has been a drop of 10% in League One and, alarmingly, 16% in League Two, with the blame being largely attached to BT Sport's blanket coverage of the Champions League. Live streaming of games is also causing fewer supporters to travel away, although I feel, no matter what the powers that be may come out with, that some of the ridiculous Tuesday night away matches doesn't help. It is a shame to watch the League show on Saturday evening and see stadiums sometimes only a third full, with some stands completely empty, often in the Championship as well. Worrying times indeed.
