Goals from Matt Harrold and Angelo Balanta put us in control until a late own goal by Mike Williamson made for a nervy last few minutes. We held on to strengthen our lead at the top. The line-up was:

His replacement, Lawrie Sanchez worked wonders to keep us up on the last day of the season when we won at Lincoln. York actually replaced us in the bottom four to go down. Amazingly, in our end of season run, we completed the over Manchester City! How double fortunes change! Our line-up against York was:
