BACK IN TIME



On the corresponding weekend five years ago to this coming one (31st) we fought out a goalless draw at

They had taken the lead in the 26th minute. Matt Phillips equalised ten minutes later with a superb shot from outside the area. Jon-Paul Pittman then grabbed the winner with ten minutes to go after coming on as a substitute.

Referee David Elleray awarded two penalties in the first half. After a trip on Andy Baird, Steve Brown scored from the spot in the 34th minute. Five minutes later, Paul McCarthy gave away a foul at the other end from which the Gills duly equalised.

Things looked good with ten minutes to go as McCarthy made amends when he scored with a looping header. However, a mistake in the 84th minute by Martin Taylor left Gillingham with an open goal, which they seized upon to score the equaliser.
